1.7. Mission Statement of the Institute as presented in the Foundation Charter

The Institute of Art History of Slovak Academy of Sciences concentrates on a research into the Slovak art history and architecture and their international context. The subject involves an investigation into painting, sculpture, handicraft and architecture since Middle Ages till 20th Century; an analysing of a historical development, international relations, iconographical motives, social bounds and theoretical aspects of history of Slovak art. Results of the research are published in a form of monographs or as journal studies.

1.8. Summary of R&D activity pursued by the institute during the assessment period in both national and international contexts, (recommended 5 pages, max. 10 pages)

The activities of the institute were focussed on a research into the Slovak art history and architecture and their international context. The institute members published their books and articles in scholarly journal and monograph chapters, presented at international scholarly conferences. Furthermore, they and solved several important problems in the sphere of monument protection and conservation and contributed to studying and representation of Slovak visual arts by investing their know-how in exhibitions.

The journal ARS, published by the Slovak Academy of Sciences in Bratislava since 1967, is devoted to the history of the visual arts and architecture in Central Europe and their European context from the early Middle Ages to the present. The eight numbers of the journal were published between 2012-2015 and distributed in more than 100 scholarly libraries.

The project "European dimensions of the artistic culture in Slovakia" (December 2010 – March 2015) aimed at establishing The national centre of excellence for research of the artistic culture in Slovakia. Based on the model of foreign centres of excellence, the centre will create opportunities for high-quality research, education and innovative activities, coordinating of scientific work of the Slovak research teams for international strategic programs and at the same time it will offer the motivating surrounding for active participation of young research workers in new projects. The Institute of Art History of SAS collaborated on the implementation of the project with the partners: Institute of World Literature of SAS, Institute of Musicology of SAS, Institute of Theatre and Film Research of SAS, Institute of Slovak Literature of SAS, Ján Stanislav Institute of Slavistics of SAS. The project was focused on the development of research infrastructure as well as the

research work with textual, visual and audio sources, resulting in the electronic database of artistic and cultural heritage in Slovakia. Its collateral activities were network seminars, international virtual conference, popularizing events and publication activities of the scholars of all the institutions of the Slovak Academy of Sciences involved in the project. The proceedings of the project conference „Art Sciences and History of Culture“ were published by the institute (Ivan GERÁT, Adam BŽOCH, Dagmar PODMAKOVÁ, Hana URBANCOVÁ, Dana HUČKOVÁ, Peter ŽEŇUCH (eds.): *Vedy o umeniach a dejiny kultúry*. Bratislava : Ústav dejín umenia SAV, 2013, ISBN 978-80-971407-5-5). The work of this project is being prolonged by an interdisciplinary research group, investigating into the artistic representations of the three Magi theme.

In the framework of this project, two monographs of the institute members were published in English: *Men of Taste. Essays on Art Collecting in East-Central Europe* is a collection of essays dedicated to collecting in Bratislava and locations inside and outside Slovakia connected to it. The essays are all concerned with a different collector Duke Albert of Saxe-Teschen, Count Pálffy, Karl Kuffner and Enea Grazioso Lanfranconi and Count Antoine E. Seilern. They establish specific examples of the history of art collecting in East-Central Europe from the eighteenth to the twentieth century. The principal aim was to show what the collecting activities of selected noble individuals contributed to international developments in art and art history (CIULISOVÁ, Ingrid: *Men of Taste : Essays on Art Collecting in East-Central Europe*. Bratislava : Veda, 2014. 174 pp. ISBN 978-80-224-1338-1).

The book *“Legendary Scenes : an Essay on Medieval Pictorial Hagiography”* is devoted mainly to scenes from the lives of saints in panel paintings originally produced in the northern regions of the Kingdom of Hungary in present-day Slovakia. The most important topoi of pictorial hagiography were described, which played an important role in the complex system of the functions of medieval images. The repetition of compositions and motifs confirmed, propagated and celebrated noble ideals. The veneration of a behaviour model gave people the chance to come into contact with the ideal in their own lives, or at least, it offered them an orientation point beyond the horizon of what was possible in reality, and its existence assured them that human endeavour had meaning. This was also why the community and patrons demanded familiar pictorial solutions, which corresponded to the recognized models of behaviour. The project of Ján Bakoš „Methodological polemics in art history 1960-1980“ dealt with the struggle between liberal "humanists" and historical relativists or between epistemological individualism and impersonal essentialism, and the polemics of the adherents to genetic method against iconologists, or structuralist criticism of conventionalism. A particular attention was devoted to the conflict between nationalist and internationalist approach and the discourse on regionalism and universalism in Central European art historiography. The analyses aimed at unveiling the ideological background of the studied methodological positions and identification of their political dimension. The project resulted in a series of essays which have been included in the book BAKOŠ, Ján. *DISCOURSES AND STRATEGIES : The Role of the Vienna School in Shaping Central European Approaches to Art History & Related Discourses*. Frankfurt a.M. : Peter Lang GmbH, 2013.

Members of the institute collaborated on the activities of monument preservation. In the framework of such a cooperation, Jozef Medvecký participated in the uncovering of medieval frescoes in the lower church of St Emmeram, Svorad a Benedikt in Nitra. These images provide a testimony of a collaboration with the most developed artistic centres in Italy. The findings were published in a monograph of the church (*The Nitra Castle and Cathedral Church - Basilica of st. Emmeram*. Nitra : Biskupský úrad, Arte Libris, 2012. 159 pp. ISBN 978-80-971057-5-4).

The International conference *Concept – Image – Reception. Baroque Ceiling Painting in the Setting of European Monasteries* took place in Bratislava in September 2013. The conference was organised by the Institute of Art History SAS in cooperation with the Research Group for Baroque Ceiling Painting in Central Europe (BCPCE), the Department of Art History, Faculty of Arts, Masaryk University in Brno and the Institute of Art History, Academy of Sciences of the Czech Republic. The main theme of the conference was the relationship between monumental ceiling paintings and texts relating to them, and their reception, in the European countries in the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries. The conference papers were published as a special issue of *Ars* (ARS, 47, 2014, Nr. 1, ISSN 0044-9008.)

Barbara Balážová has published a monograph *Medzi Prahou a Norimbergom, Viedňou a Banskou Štiavnicou. Ulrich Reutter a jeho svet okolo 1600*. [Between Prague and Nuremberg, Vienna and Banská Štiavnica. Ulrich Reutter and His World around 1600] Bratislava : Societas historiae artium, 2013, 148 pp., 58 ill. ISBN 978-80-970304-2-1. What the author tried to follow using three memory or friendship books (*album amicorum*) of Ulrich Reutter (1563 – 1619) as well as other written archival and visual sources was not only the basic analysis of each entry but also the cultural experience of concrete individuality around 1600 in Central Europe. This type of description is already significant for historical anthropology when dealing with classical subjects or such topics as the historical development of the family, history of birth and death, history of rituals, history of daily life or history of mentalities. Thanks to more than 550 entries dedicated to Ulrich Reutter she was able to reconstruct his significant life experience on one side but on the other side also his cultural experience and interactions which were headed to the different literary works, medals and craftworks ordered as well as dedicated to him. By tracking those cultural interactions the monograph leads us to the more global phenomenon as the self-representation through the art, relation between education and donorship in the Early Modern Europe, as well as migration of elites and their dependence on the cultural centers such Nuremberg or Vienna.

The project of Jozef Medvecký „*Baroque in Slovakia – Baroque Art in Central Europe – Late Baroque Painting - Artist's Monograph*“ resulted in an artist's monograph based on a new assessment of the work and personality of Anton Schmidt (1713 – 1773), the important painter of Viennese origin but active in the area of Central Slovak Mining towns in the Late Baroque period (*Anton Schmidt 1713 – 1773. Život a dielo barokového maliara*. Societas historiae artium : Bratislava 2013, 256 pp., 285 fig., ISBN 978-80-970304-3-8. Another project of the same author was devoted to interpretation and presentation of artworks of the important Italian painter Carpofo Tencalla (1623 – 1684) His frescoes at Červený Kameň Castle anchored in the tradition of Italian Seicento. Their iconographic program of the decoration in the unique *salla terrena* has been interpreted as a typical sign of the change of taste in the mid-17th century. Detailed examination of these issues and systematic work on the project resulted in a comprehensive assessment of the artist's work, who utilized the lessons gained in the pivotal artistic centers and met the needs of his Central European customers (MEDVECKÝ Jozef. *Anjelský hrad v Karpatoch. Carpofo Tencalla a ranobaroková výzdoba hradu Červený Kameň*. [The Angel Castle in the Carpathians. Carpofo Tencalla and the Early Baroque Decoration of the Castle Červený Kameň]. Bratislava : Societas historiae artium a Ústavo dejín umenia SAV, 2015, 187 pp., 180 fig., ISBN 978-80-970304-4-5).

The book *Spiš Altars in the 19th Century* by Marta Herucová offers an erudite picture of the history and art of little-known monuments. It reveals their donors and creators on the background of the events of that time. It pursues interesting matters connected with certain altarpieces, whether they concern iconography, subjects or inspirations and models regardless of the confession. It contributes to the deepening of expert as well as common awareness of the *ars sacra* in the regional and European relations. The monograph of Bibiana Pomfyová *The Medieval Bíňa : Archeology – History – Architecture* focuses on the medieval settlement and history of the important polycultural site. Interdisciplinary work summarizes the knowledge of the art-historical, archaeological and historical research. The publication is aimed on four sacral buildings. One of them (St. Nicholas' Church) is connected with a hypothesis about the existence of a Benedictine monastery. Another three monuments – Church of the Virgin Mary, Chapel of the Twelve Apostles, and St. Catherine's Chapel – were related to the existence of a Premonstratensian monastery. The publication completes, revises, or rebuts up-to-date interpretations and hypothesis. In large measure the authors base their findings on archive research and on up-to-now unpublished archive materials. Through the examples of the sacral buildings from Bíňa the problematic fields are analysed related to the Medieval monasteries and monastery architecture: existence of a specific order architecture and other. Owing to her participation in the international project *Court Residences as Places of Exchange in Late Medieval and Early Modern Europe (1400-1700) – Palatium*, funded by the European Science Foundation, Ingrid Ciulisová has co-edited (with Herbert Karner and Bernardo J. García García) *The Habsburgs and their Courts in Europe, 1400–1700 : Between Cosmopolitanism and Regionalism* (www.courtresidences.eu, Österreichische Akademie der Wissenschaften, 2014, Palatium e-Publication, Volume 1, ISBN 978-94-6018-483-3). She was also the editor of the book *Artistic Innovations and Cultural Zones* (Peter Lang, Frankfurt am Main - Vydavateľstvo VEDA, Bratislava, 2014, Spectrum Slovakia, Volume 7, ISBN 978-3-631-66122-2).

Another book edited by Ingrid Ciulisová has been prepared in collaboration with Peter Lang Verlag and partially funded by The Lila Acheson Wallace-Reader's Digest Publications grant, awarded to the author by Villa I Tatti, the Harvard University Center for Italian Renaissance Studies (CIULISOVÁ Ingrid (ed.). *Artistic Innovations and Cultural Zones*. Frankfurt am Main : Peter Lang Publishing Group, Bratislava : Veda, 2014, 296 pp. (Spectrum Slovakia), Vol. 7. ISBN 978-3-631-66122-2). The book includes the study Rogier van der Weyden and Veit Stoss and Their Two Followers by Ingrid Ciulisová.

Ivan Gerát has actively participated in the international project „Transferts et circulations artistiques en Europe à l'époque gothique (XIIe – XVIe siècles)“ organized around the Institut national d'histoire de l'art in Paris. He presented the results of his research on the conference „Les transferts iconographiques et stylistiques à l'époque gothique“ in Liège, Belgium 16.11.2012. The project of Zuzana Bartošová was dealing with the research and interpretation of varied artistic life in Košice between the two world wars. The basic research focused on activities of individual personalities, notably JUDr. Josef Polák, custodian and later director of the East Slovakian Museum, Eugen Krón, graphic artist who ran a private art school, and Anna Lesznai, textile artist and illustrator. In addition, the interpretation in the publication *Košice modernism and its wider context* based on relevant studies also included Košice activities of other significant personalities, such as János Mácsa, organiser of cultural and political events; painters Anton Jaszusch, František Foltýn, Gejza Schiller, Alexander Bortnyik, Konštantín Bauer, Július Jakoby, Koloman Sokol, Imrich Oravec, Ľudovít Feld; and Lajos Kassák, poet, theorist of the avant-garde and visual artist. Bartošová was a co-author of the exhibition in the Gallery of Eastern Slovakia in Košice, as well as of a text in the exhibition catalogue KISS-SZEMÁN, Zsófia –

LEŠKOVÁ, Lena (eds.): *Košická moderna. Umenie Košíc v dvadsiatych rokoch 20. storočia* [Košice Modernism. Košice Art in the Nineteen-Twenties]. Košice : Východoslovenská galéria, 2013. The exhibition was repeated in Bratislava 2014 (BARTOŠOVÁ Zuzana – BURDZIŇSKI Michał – HOMOL'OVÁ Alexandra (exhibition curators): *Košická moderna a jej kontext* [Košice Modernism and its Context]. Slovak National Gallery, vernissage 4. 12. 2014)

Zuzana Bartošová has also curated the exhibition Independent Scene/Slovak Visual Art 1960 – 2000, presented at the Embassy of the Slovak Republic in London in the year 2012. The exhibition has been introduced by Henry Meyiric Hughes, the long serving president of Association internationale des critiques d'art (AICA) and the former director of Art Council in Great Britain.

The volume *Bella Italia*, edited by Dana Bořutová, in a series of in-depth studies, features varied facets of multifarious interconnections between the 19th c. arts in Slovakia and artistic centres of Italy. At the same time, it represents a solid basis for future scholarship in the topic. Exploiting extensive basic research (archives, libraries, documentation centres, collections), it brings numerous novel findings and arguments. The same author prepared a scenario of the exhibition „A TRIBUTE TO THE VICTIMS. Military Cemeteries of Architect Dušan Jurkovič“ using the results of her previous research into the work of the architect Dušan Jurkovič. The exhibition took place in the Museum of sepulchral culture in Kassel, Germany, 2014, and was accompanied by a large scholarly catalogue.

2.8. Background and management. Human resources and implementation of recommendations from previous assessment

There were four recommendations in the previous assessment, all of which have been considered by the institute's management. 1, as for gaining young colleagues, we have hired Veronika Kucharská, PhD (37) and Peter Megyeši, PhD (31); 2, the activities in attaining the competence for pursuing a PhD education – the lack of the co-workers with the title of ordinary university professor, which has been the main obstacle in accreditation, has been successfully compensated by the inauguration of Ivan Gerát in Trnava (having completed all criteria and passed all procedures at the faculty and university level, he is currently waiting the official nomination by the president of Slovak Republic, which is the last formal step prescribed by the Slovak Law). After that, all obstacles will be removed; 3, the recommendation to gain team project of basic research has been met by gaining the projects the VEGA and APVV agencies; 4, the works on digitalizing the institute's archived have been substantially moved forward in the framework of the project European dimensions of artistic culture in Slovakia (ca 2500 records digitalized and put in the framework of the new database).

- **Supplementary information and/or comments on management, research infrastructure, and trends in personnel development**

There is a plan to integrate smaller research institute in the larger unit in the context of the transformation of the Slovak Academy of Sciences. The new law, which is under preparation, is confronting the institutions with some demands, which are hard to fulfil for smaller units.

In the last years, there have been two attempts how to react to this development – the first one – integration of the institutes, focused on art sciences (including music, theatre, film, and literature) did not succeed due to the lack of will of some partners. The alternative plan focused on the strategy of integration of the research activities in the field of history of culture under a future centre for historical research, created around the Institute of History SAS. This alternative is currently being further negotiated.

3. Research strategy and future development of the institute for the next five years (2016-2020) (Recommended 3 pages, max. 5 pages)

The research work of the institute has been based in the complex web of tensions and relations between global framework of art historical activities, represented mostly by leading research institutes in Europe and Nord America, and the traditions of dealing with local problems of Slovakia, the country, historically belonging to the contexts of the Danube monarchy and Czechoslovakia. The institute remains a single and unique institution in Slovakia having its mission fully concentrated on research in the history of art. Considering the size of the institute and of available resources, the focus of our activities is formed by research programs of small teams or of individual researchers working according to the needs of a particular research task. In several cases, the institute is coordinating larger work going beyond the institute boundaries and even the borders of the country.

Since its founding by Marián Vároš, who combined art historical interest with his profound philosophical education (PhD in Paris and Cambridge), and the year under the guidance of Ján Bakoš, who has inspired research activities in historiography and methodology of the discipline, the research work of the institute has obtained an important theoretical dimension. Since then, the members of the institute have several times successfully integrated their research programs in the international projects, conferences and publications. The institute has been a focus of international academic exchange, accepting visitors from other countries who wish to perform their research in Slovakia.

The institute has been a founding member of the international group “Research Institute in Art History” (RIHA) and actively participates in its initiatives, including the production of the RIHA journal. The research work and international contacts of the institute have been materialized in the international communication, publication and distribution strategy of the ARS journal, which is currently distributed into more than 100 research libraries in Europe and Nord America. We are planning the continue this tradition.

The empirical and theoretical work, performed at the institute aims at identification of existing art historical values – which are frequently forgotten – as a means of value production for contemporary culture and society.

Currently, a free continuation of this research program is focused on the problems of the discipline in context of totalitarian regimes, with international cooperation in several projects based at the Humboldt University in Berlin (Prof. Michaela Marek) and at the University of Michigan (Prof. Elizabeth Sears). The example of “Marxist iconology”, studied in this framework, makes it possible to pose a question about the demarcation line between the ideas belonging to a genuine social history of art, which would become a legitimate intellectual tradition at many western universities, and the opportunist acceptance of certain Marxist-Leninist doctrines motivated by pragmatic calculations beyond academic interest in the subject of investigation. In Czechoslovakia, one of the best early examples of social history of art (Antal, 1948) was translated immediately, but the first great synthesis (Hauser, 1951) remained without a translation as well as without substantial influence. Was the “Marxism” of iconologists in Czechoslovakia real intellectual endeavour, or was it only a somewhat clumsy (possibly intentionally clumsy) answer to what was asked by the programmatic documents of “socialist art history”, formulated in 1951? Was there a true intellectual dialogue with an understanding and a critique of iconology and of social history of art from the positions inspired by critical rationalism of Karl Popper, as represented by Ernst Hans Gombrich? What was the relation of these authors to anthropological research and popular culture, begun already by Warburg and continued e.g. by French structuralist scholars?

Team projects

The tradition of iconology is not only studied in its historiographic dimensions, but also used in a larger exemplary case study – a multi-disciplinary project studying the artistic representations of the three Magi theme in the artistic traditions of Slovakia and in the culture of several countries. The surviving of the basic subject and its motifs on different cultural levels opens many interesting problems and possibilities how to record, document and study the theme from the point of view of different disciplines. History and theories of fine arts, theatre and music are in the centre of our attention in this project, which has gained the funding from the Research and Development Agency for the period 2016-2020. Through the interdisciplinary dialog the new prospective will be opened especially at that point when the different representations of the theme of research cross and form the concrete historical image of piety, commemorating, ritual practices or theatrical performances. In the research group, the institute is represented by Ivan Gerát, Barbara Balážová and Peter Megyeši. The project makes possible to hire high-quality scholars on a temporary basis according to the standards of leading scholarly centers. This applies to other professionals, such as photographers etc. This open policy can be of help for other institutions in Slovakia, dealing with cultural heritage.

We are studying sometimes overlooked relations between the best production of the most creative metropolises and the popular culture in Slovakia in this context, taking into account diversity of the languages and mediums. The phenomenon of surviving and reviving of the texts and ritual practices could be understood as a background for the analysis of the specific interpretations in different media types and social contexts. The rich semantics of the Three Magi in the variable historical contexts will be demonstrated using many real artworks and reconstructing sociological contexts as well as dynamic development of this theme. This subject, based on the meeting of powerful secular representatives or oriental wisdom with a magic child, includes also several psychological moments, which were used by the artists for a vivid contact with percipients.

A complementary research project of partially identic research group in collaboration with philosophers, cognitive scientists and theologians from the University of Trnava, focusses on the Fundamental Concepts of Image Theory in Interdisciplinary Reflexion and Art-historical Application and will be supported by the Scientific Grant Agency until 2018. The investigation into the fundamental concepts of image theory, which is the core of the project, is taking

place in an interdisciplinary dialogue between art history and a broad spectrum of theoretical disciplines (philosophy, theology, psychology, cognitive sciences). The chosen concepts, e.g. "image", "representation", "function" or "symbol" are being analyzed on theoretical level and, simultaneously, applied in form of case studies, devoted to early medieval visual culture in a geographical space between Vienna and Kraków. A view on the different functions of image in the liturgical and architectonical space will be a particular focus of the planned interdisciplinary research. Analyzing chosen examples, we attempt to synthesize knowledge from the contemporary theory of image, iconography, iconology, phenomenology, theology and history of liturgy.

Individual research projects

Several individual research projects are devoted to important dimensions of visual arts in Slovakia. Their individual creative programs are based on current research paradigms and conceptual platforms. All the projects are studying the problems of artistic and cultural transfer and adaptation of ideas, frequently associated with the re-evaluation of existing artworks. The institute is a single institution in Slovakia whose members can concentrate on a task with objectives and methodology defined according to the principles of academic freedom and curiosity driven research. In this sense, the institute continues to pursue its activities free of political mentoring or market pressures.

The theoretical work of Ján Bakoš still continues focusing on the concept of style. He analyses the reasons why the concept of style became the basis of art historical research and the history of style had been considered as the main idea of art history till the beginning of the 20th century. He is mapping of the changes in the notion of style and reconstructing the transformations of the relationship between the history of style and other conceptions of the history of art. Simultaneously, he is looking for reasons why some art historians have lost their interest in style at the end of the 20th century while others attempted to revive the idea of style.

A project by Bibiana Pomfyová (in collaboration with Comenius University) is devoted to the monasteries of mendicant orders in Slovakia. Within the project, the art-historical analysis of existing monument is being complemented by studies of archaeological, epigraphic, and palaeographic monuments. The results will be processed and assembled in a standard scholarly catalogue. The sacral space is being investigated as a place of interaction between the action (liturgy, homilies, various social reunions and events), material architectural frame, and other parts that shaped the interior and exterior of mendicant edifices.

Ingrid Ciulisová is studying the artistic communication between the Central and Eastern Europe and the Low Countries. She currently focusses on the Gothic panel painting of St Martin's cathedral at Spišská Kapitula, a part of the UNESCO World Heritage list. Regional art historians have pursued their research on Spišská Kapitula panel paintings of the second half of the fifteenth and the beginning of the sixteenth century mainly within regional 'Hungarian' art historical context. The aim of this project is to emphasize its broader European artistic relationships.

Jozef Medvecký is studying the relationships between painting and graphics in the Baroque period. He analyses the role and importance of reproduced graphic models as an inspiration in the creation process of wall paintings preserved in Slovakia. Together with Barbara Balážová, his work is a part of the Research Group for Baroque Ceiling Painting in Central Europe (BCPCE), which has been established in Vienna (2006), as an association of academic and university research centers and individuals sharing an interest in research on the monumental painting of the 17th and 18th centuries and in multilateral international cooperation. The Research Group brings together members from Austria, Croatia, the Czech Republic, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Poland, Slovakia, Slovenia, the United States of America and other countries. Members of the Research Group develop professional cooperation in the fields of systematic documentation, classification, building catalogues, and the interpretation, protection and preservation of early modern, especially Baroque, ceiling and wall paintings in the Central European region and Italy.

Marta Herucová focusses on Classicism as one of the key styles of the 2nd half of 18th and 19th century. Classicism developed in several phases from Baroque Classicism, Louis XVI style and Empire style to Neoclassicism. It was developed under the influence of Enlightenment and affected all forms of art. Paintings and sculptures, drawings and graphics preserved in Slovakia show a strong perception of this style. Certain art works class directly as the artistic achievements of French, British, Italian, German, and Austrian provenance, others followed them, and it is possible to discuss also some interesting Slovak connections. She is attempting to offer a representative overview and art historical analyses of Classicistic art works in Slovakia, paying attention to the conditions of their creation, to their histories, meanings as well as donators. A monograph, resulting from this project, will complement existing academic works about musical Classicism and Classicistic architecture in Slovakia, Austrian Classicism (Hagen 2002, Frodl 2002, Telesko 2006), and Hungarian Classicism (Sisa 2006).

The research project Slovak-French and French-Slovak relations in the area of fine art in the 20th century by Zuzana Bartošová focuses on the first half of the 20th century, when Paris was a center of artistic life and several Slovak artists travelled to Paris to get acquainted with modern and avant-garde art. The goal of the project is to examine, map, specify and interpret these relations by means of a research in private and public archives, trying to identify particular sources of inspiration of individual artists and artistic programs. In the second half of the 20th century, this tradition was continued due to the interest of some prominent Parisian art critics and theorists in our fine art of Slovakia, which is a new topic to be analyzed.

Postgraduate education

Prolonging the long-lasting previous experience and the existing collaboration with the University of Trnava, the institute will attempt to become an important place of postgraduate education in art history. Several members of the institute have recently gained the academic qualification necessary to establish the institute as an autonomous unit of postgraduate education (within the limits imposed by existing Slovak law, which presupposes collaboration with a university). Simultaneously, the institute will continue its existing cooperation with other universities in Central Europe in the sphere of education, with members of institute leading regular courses or teaching in the summer schools.

Library, documentation, archive, technical infrastructure

The art-historical documentation at the institute has been significantly moved into the digital epoch owing to implementation of the project "European dimensions of artistic culture in Slovakia". The infrastructure, acquired in the framework of this project, is being used not only within the institute, but in the international cooperation with the project "Forschungsinfrastruktur Kunstdenkmäler in Ostmitteleuropa", based on the Herder Institute in Marburg. The contract fixing this collaboration is valid until 2017. The institute will continue its collaboration with professional photographers producing high-quality images for its publications, for exchange and for future record.

3.1. Present state of the art in both the national and the international contexts

The current confrontation with the rise of nationalisms in Central Europe poses new challenges for humanities. Some important centres of art historical research focus on the history of art as history of dynasties. This way of thinking has been established by nationalisms of the 19th century. Our way of dealing with the history of art in Slovakia tries to intensify existing communication with such centres in the history of art and visual culture, which are seriously considering art as a universal manifestation of humanity in a specific historical situation. More specifically, this means a communication with the current developments around iconology, social history of art and historical anthropology.
