Institute of Musicology SAS has had a long-term profile as an institution of basic research, which develops knowledge in all three disciplines of musicology: historical musicology, ethnomusicology, and systematic musicology. The idea of representing the three disciplines of musicology in one institution took shape specifically in the Central European setting and has analogies in several academic musical centres in neighbouring countries (especially Hungary and Poland). The research programme of the Institute is organised according to three departments, which enter into mutual collaboration: **Department for Music History**, **Department for Ethnomusicology**, and **Department for Systematic Musicology**. The basic conception of the Institute places emphasis on nationally and territorially oriented research, which is linked to the wider transregional, Central European and European contexts and directed according to current methodological trends in the European space.

During the evaluated period research was performed both in Slovakia and abroad, mainly in the neighbouring countries. In the research processes, use was made of notational, textual, iconographic, sound and audiovisual media, which were sometimes combined in multimedia and multidisciplinary projects and serve to mediate complex information on music. A special attention was dedicated to Digital Humanities and their potentials for basic research, archiving, reconstruction and processing of musical material and international networking.

In the period under evaluation the Institute of Musicology SAS continued to do basic research, and to a small extent also applied research, in four dominant research fields:

#### **Cultural Heritage of Slovakia in Music**

The pivotal activity is a long-term research task focused on **reconstruction of the history of Slovak music and music on the territory of Slovakia** in chronological progression from the Middle Ages to the 20th century, coordinated from the Department for Music History. During the evaluated period it was conducted in greater measure on the basis of comparative perspective and with a multidisciplinary scope.

The majority of research themes and grant projects, despite their partial range, tend to contribute towards the preparation of a new synthetic history of Slovak music. At the same time, current research has covered little-studied or insufficiently considered style periods, music genres, institutions, and personalities. Among the most significant results are partial syntheses in the form of collective monographs, which were the fruit of collaboration with authors from an external milieu. In the national context these monographs represent the first important syntheses of the most up-to-date knowledge of medieval liturgical music (Eva Veselovská et al., AAB 2017) and of hymns in Slovakia between written and oral tradition (Peter Ruščin et al., AAB 2019), from the standpoint of a new generation of Slovak researchers.

Departmental staff have participated in preparing and publishing a collective monograph on the history of music in Bratislava, to which they contributed several crucial chapters on the medieval period and the 19th century (Eva Veselovská, Jana Lengová, ABD, AEDA 2019). This monographic synthesis, emerging in collaboration between authors from several institutions in Slovakia, constitutes an internationally relevant contribution to the study of historical urban forms of music culture.

Important findings from both the national and international standpoints were achieved in music topography, as a specific research area of music historiography. The territorial mapping of music data brings findings which have a long-term and exceptionally wide usefulness in further research, not only in the domestic context but also for comparative purposes in further European regions. An extensive work of encyclopaedic orientation has been issued on the topography of music in Slovakia during the period of classicism (Darina Múdra, AAB 2019). This work is the culmination of the author's life-long research in mapping the music factography of the territory of Slovakia during the given period, with a methodological usefulness for analogically orientated research in foreign countries also.

Work with domestic music sources culminated in the preparation of critical editions (Janka Petőczová, AAB 2018) and music anthologies (Hana Urbancová et al., AAB 2021), scholarly catalogues (Eva Veselovská et al., AAB 2019 – 2021) and databases, which significantly complement national research, while being employed in the international context also.

Part of reconstructing the history of music in Slovakia is to trace the reception of the art, poetics and aesthetics of important European composers. During the evaluated period, explorations on this theme were devoted principally to the reception of the music of German and Austrian composers (Jana Lengová, Vladimír Fulka).

A second important area of research of the cultural heritage is **Slovak folk music in historical sources and contemporary changes**. Research was conducted in the Department for Ethnomusicology. During the evaluated period, attention was devoted to several categories of song genres, and the tendency is towards the preparation of a new synthesis about genre systematics in Slovak song culture (Hana Urbancová). Results were presented at scholarly events in European and extra-European regions and published in journals and essay volumes.

The third area is **research of historical organs** in Slovakia from the standpoint of organology and music acoustics, with applications in restoration practice. This research was conducted in the Department for Systematic Musicology and in the Technical Laboratory of the Institute (Andrej Štafura, Štefan Nagy), in a broader transdisciplinary collaboration with institutes from other departments of the Slovak Academy of Sciences. From this collaboration a patent emerged and was accepted, in which the contributors were, besides the Institute of Musicology SAS, also the

Institute of Molecular Biology SAS and the Institute of Chemistry SAS, as well as a university institution (Technical University in Zvolen, Faculty of Wood Science and Technology).

Findings from research of the cultural heritage in music were presented especially at national and international musicological and interdisciplinary conferences organised by the Institute during the evaluated period. The new acquisitions of knowledge are put directly to use in music education, in the concert life and folklorism, in the work of memorial institutions (museums, archives), in tourism, and in the renovation of cultural monuments.

### **Music and Gender**

During the evaluated period a number of research themes were finalised which took inspiration from gender studies and developed those on the basis of music. Thanks to this, gender questions have been addressed for the first time in the national context in a complex form – involving cooperation of all departments of the Institute, with research being coordinated from the Department for Ethnomusicology. Attention was devoted to women and their representation in the musical culture of Slovakia in various historical periods and musical genres. The most important findings were communicated firstly in a thematic essay volume (ed. Hana Urbancová, FAI 2019), and secondly in an individual monograph devoted to the profile of the female musician and writer Stephanie Wurmbrand-Stuppach, who lived at the interface of a number of cultures (Jana Lengová, AAB 2019). This monograph represents an important typological complement to the profile of the male composer and artist Tadeáš Salva (Michal Ščepán, AAB 2020), and this not only from the standpoint of gender studies but also of the methodology of processing the life story and work of the selected individual. As a result, there are two representative publications about personalities of music and art with importance for the territory of Slovakia. From a methodological standpoint they provide two divergent models, relevant in the international context, for the study of the relation of life and work.

These works are not only a contribution to a more complex view of the phenomenon of musical culture, but at the same time they contribute generally to forming a greater sensitivity to gender questions in contemporary society.

### **Music of Ethnic Minorities**

The historical ethnic minorities are among the long-term areas of research in the Department for Ethnomusicology. They complete the picture of traditional Slovak music and music on the territory of Slovakia. During the evaluated period attention was focused firstly on Slovak enclaves abroad, and secondly on Roma communities in Slovakia. Two monographs were published with rich material supplements. In the first instance this was a representative synthesis, which brought to a conclusion many years of researching the Roma songs “phurikane gil'a” in Slovakia (Jana Belišová, AAB 2018). The second case was a representative monograph on the song culture of Slovaks in the Stará Pazova locality in Serbia, which opens new research of the traditional music of Slovaks in Vojvodina (Kristina Lomen, AAB 2021). The importance of the study of ethnic minorities is connected with the minority setting, where it offers its findings for further use to support minority culture. On the other hand, it contributes to their integration into the majority society via the information about their culture of traditional singing.

The findings of research in the area of gender studies and minority studies was presented especially at scholarly events abroad, where they formed part of current international discourse.

Their contribution consists not only in an expansion of the material background of the given themes but also in methodological stimulation.

## **History of the Scholarly Discipline**

Researching the history of the scholarly discipline is an important part of its self-reflection. There have been elaborate explorations of the history of music theory in Slovakia in the Central European context, which were presented at an international conference and in a published collection of papers (Jana Lengová, Janka Petőczová, Hana Urbancová, AFD 2020). The history of Slovak ethnomusicology via selected areas of traditional music, in the context of musicology, ethnology and cultural anthropology, is mapped by a monograph (Hana Urbancová, AAB 2016), which also serves as a textbook.

## **2.1.8. Narrative on the most important research outputs of the institute – especially focused on their importance for society (3-5 pages)**

A standard and representative type of publication output is monographic syntheses, which are among the most important means of making available research findings, especially in historical musicology and ethnomusicology. Specific publication outputs include critical editions and anthologies, scholarly catalogues and databases. These are the fruit of research, reconstruction, analysis and interpretation of music sources, and they are used not only in further research but also in practical musical activity.

### **Individual and Collective Monographic Syntheses**

Darina Múdra's *Topografia hudby klasicizmu na Slovensku (z pohľadu kanonických vizitácií)* [Topography of the Music of the Classical Period in Slovakia: From the Perspective of Canonical Visitations] (2019) is the first work of its kind in Slovakia. The first part provides an extensive study with analytic-evaluative focus. The second part includes a source section with data from over 1620 visitations (which yield 1650 names of musicians, 1670 data of musical instruments) and also a set of inventories of the written music and musical instruments of the time. A third part comprises registers necessary for an operative use of the source database. The outstanding value of the publication consists in offering a new picture of the music network of classicism in Slovakia, revealing its participants and offering a view of the structure and transformation of contemporary music. The publication aims to serve a further generation as the base for future syntheses of the history of music culture in the epoch of classicism in Slovakia in the context of Central European history, and offers a new methodological approach for analogically orientated research in foreign countries also.

*Duchovná pieseň medzi písomnou a ústnou tradíciou : Súvislosti hymnologických prameňov z územia Slovenska* [The Hymn Between Oral and Written Tradition: the Contexts of Hymnological Sources from the Territory of Slovakia] (2019) is a monograph which provides an analytical view by three authors of the melodic material of the most important Slovak and German hymnological sources from the 17th and 18th centuries (Peter Ruščin, Eva Veselovská, Zlatica Kendrová). Special attention is given to the wider connections of hymns to the oral tradition of Catholic and Lutheran sacred song on the territory of Slovakia. Included in the book is a catalogue of incipits of 261 tunes of hymns from contemporary hymnbooks.

*Stephanie Wurmbrand-Stuppachová (1849 – 1919) : Život, dielo, korešpondencia* [Stephanie Wurmbrand-Stuppach (1849 – 1919) : Life, Work, Correspondence] (2019) is a scholarly biography by Jana Lengová of a female pianist, composer and writer, the fruit of many years of source research in Slovakia and abroad. It is the first monograph book on a little-known female personality

of Slovak and Central European music history in the second half of the 19th century. The semantic connections of her musical composition are considered in the light of autobiographical facts and extra-musical influences. Her creative orientation and application are examined from the gender aspect and with regard to contemporary social conventions and the lifestyle of bourgeoisie and aristocracy. Its complex approach, interpretation and treatment of the issues make this an important contribution to the methodology of a personality research in music and art.

### Critical Editions and Anthologies of Music Sources

*Music for the Feast of Three Kings in Slovakia: from the Middle Ages to the 20th Century* (2021), a bilingual publication with English and Slovak versions, offers a new view of Three Kings music from the territory of Slovakia in its changing genres, styles and functions. It maps the music tradition from the territory of Slovakia, which emerged in the learned setting of medieval monasteries, afterwards shifted to the space of the churches, and in its final stage of development permeated the broad strata of the bearers of this culture outside of the church in a rural setting. The collective monograph (Hana Urbancová, Peter Ruščin, Eva Veselovská) elucidates this music as a liturgical, occasional and ceremonial-customary repertoire. In a unique manner it combines several historical forms of Three Kings music (Gregorian chant, hymns, pastorelas, carols) and makes them accessible in the publication, which includes a critical edition of the musical repertoire.

### Scholarly Catalogues and Databases

Contributing to research of medieval music culture in the international context, there has been further continuation in processing the fragmentarily preserved manuscripts from the territory of Slovakia in an edition of scholarly catalogues entitled *Catalogus fragmentorum cum notis musicis medii aevi in Slovacia*. The last three volumes (Tomus V. Kežmarok 2019, Tomus VI. Trenčín 2021, Tomus VII. Betliar 2021) provide new, ground-breaking findings for the cultural history of medieval Hungary and elucidate unique discoveries of fragmentarily preserved manuscripts from the territory of Slovakia and abroad (Poland, Bohemia, Moravia, Austria, Hungary, Belgium). Since its inception (2008) the edition has aimed to make accessible, and to process in scholarly fashion, a specific group of the oldest written music sources from Slovakia, which have been preserved in fragmentary form. Precious written sources dating from the late 11th to the early 16th century have been the object of research. The edition was founded by Eva Veselovská, who is also one of the contributing authors.

The Slovak Early Music Database *Cantus Planus in Slovacia* focuses on making accessible the oldest manuscripts and fragmentary preserved notated sources from Slovakia in form of the full-text database in English language (from the time period of the late 11th century to the beginning of the 16th century). The Database is coordinated by the Institute of Musicology SAS, in collaboration with other scientific and educational institutions. Since 2012, the database is part of an international *Cantus Index Network* of medieval liturgical texts and music sources.

The Institute of Musicology SAS maintains a long-term collaboration as a partner institution within the international project *The Digital Analysis of Chant Transmission* coordinated from Canada (DACT, principal investigator: Jennifer Bain, Dahlhousie University). The aim of this project is to process and transfer the results of research on medieval music through Digital Humanities.

The Institute has been involved in bilateral collaboration with the Hungarian Academy of Sciences (MAD project). This collaboration was followed by two other projects: the Mobility project with the Austrian partner institution (Klosterneuburg Monastery, Austria) and the trilateral project *Music in Central Europe: Local Elements - Transregional Connections - International Research*, together with the Czech Academy of Sciences and the Research Centre for the Humanities, Hungarian Academy of Sciences in Budapest. In the framework of this project, five international lectures (USA, Poland, Hungary, Austria, Czech Republic) were held in the pandemic years 2020 – 2021. The Institute of Musicology SAS has had an accredited programme of doctoral study, *Musicology*, since 2014. Following changes in the system of study programmes at the turn of the year 2022, from September 2022 the Institute will conduct a new integrated programme of doctoral studies, *Art Studies*, with specialisation in musicology.

In harmony with the new requirements for quality of doctoral study in the Slovak Academy of Sciences, an “Internal System of Evaluation of the Quality of Doctoral Study in the Institute of Musicology SAS” was developed and approved early in 2020. Implementation of this document contributed to raising the quality of doctoral study at the Institute. PhD students participate actively in international conferences, publish both in Slovakia and abroad, and via participation in the Institute’s grant projects, are directly integrated into its research programme. In the course of their studies PhD students are expected to complete a study stay at a university abroad or at a partner institute.

For the period under evaluation, Institute staff were involved in educational processes via a number of forms of activities. As teachers, they worked externally at several universities in Slovakia (Comenius University Bratislava, University of Prešov, Academy of Performing Arts in Bratislava). They provided cycles of lectures or individual lectures in their research fields; they directed or gave consultations on Bachelor and Masters works; and they were members of several commissions for doctoral study.

Since 2020 the Institute has collaborated in dual doctoral study (cotutelle) with universities in the Czech Republic. Following the first positive experiences in this type of doctoral study in collaboration with the Faculty of Arts, Masaryk University Brno, we will increase the number of students in this type of PhD study. Dual study is particularly useful for the so-called “small scholarly disciplines”. Furthermore, via cotutelle it was possible also to prepare doctoral study with an interdisciplinary composition, and that proved particularly useful for musicological themes with an interdisciplinary background. In future we plan to extend collaboration with foreign universities to other Central European countries.

### **The Musical Culture of the Roma**

The Institute of Musicology SAS has conducted systematic research of the musical culture of Slovak Roma since 2010. Findings are orientated towards both the minority and majority environment. On the one hand, they contribute to preserving and revitalising the vanishing music tradition of the Roma, in that they are offered to the Roma themselves. On the other hand, they map the current musical activities of the Roma, not only in their own social and cultural setting but also beyond its bounds. Music remains an important element of ethnic and cultural identity of Roma in Slovakia and an important instrument for their self-awareness and mechanisms of self-evaluation. At the same time, music makes a notable contribution to breaking down the barrier between Roma and the majority society (participation of Roma singers and musicians in musical, multi-genre, cultural and social undertakings, projects and presentations).

The core activity has been field work, sound and audiovisual documentation of the contemporary condition and changes of Roma singing and music in Roma villages in Slovakia. Findings have been made available in the form of scholarly outputs (monographs, articles, editions of materials), artistic outputs as social documentaries (films, photographs), concerts, workshops as well as popularisation. The aim of all activities was to communicate to the broad public just how important a role song and music have in the lives of Roma, particularly in isolated communities, and to contribute to a positive image of this ethnic group in Slovak society.

### **Historical Organs in Slovakia**

The organology represented in the Institute of Musicology SAS has specialised in historical organs in the regions of Slovakia, including issues of their restoration. Research was focused on evidence of musical instruments (predominantly historical church organs), documentation of their technical state, and definition of their historical and artistic value. Part of the research involved identification of problems and seeking means of removing them during restoration, in such a way that the musical instrument could return to artistic, liturgical or concert practice. The research was conducted in transdisciplinary collaboration. Its results were scholarly publications (monographs, articles), artistic outputs (music festivals, recordings of the historical repertoire on restored instruments), collaboration with institutions from the decision-making sphere (The Monuments Board of the Slovak Republic), and a patent. The patent (Biopreparation from Exiguobacterium undae) emerged as part of an experiment in the search for new possibilities of restoring the wooden sections of musical instruments. Its use, however, has wider perspectives, including outside organological practice.

Research and restoration of historical organs has an impact on the formation of local, regional and national identity. Restored musical instruments, as musical, artistic and memorial objects, are involved in undertakings of larger cultural, historical and social significance and have become part of cultural tourism (e.g. inclusion in the Gothic Journey project).

## Sources of Slovak Music

In the Institute of Musicology SAS there is a special place for processing primary music sources (individual compositions, music collections, manuscripts, old prints). Work with music sources, including the discovery of new, hitherto unknown sources, has a special importance not only for musicological research but also for artistic practice, concert activities and music education. A specific output from the research of primary music sources is critical source editions, which are used not only in further musicological research but also in musical practice. Critical editions of music, which make accessible hitherto unknown sources or known works in a new editorial treatment, are of service to musicians for the adequate study of the given composition, for extending the repertoire, and for presentation of the work at concerts, in music broadcasting, or via sound recordings. In such a form they have the prerequisites for becoming incorporated in contemporary concert activities, in the media, and on sound devices.

Attention has been focused particularly on music sources of older historical periods (Renaissance, Baroque) which indicate broader European linkages of domestic musical composition (edition of *Musica Scepusii Veteris*). Music sources from the 19th century document the birth and formation of national music (edition of *Complete Works of Ján Levoslav Bella*). An anthology devoted to musical genres connected with the feast of Three Kings and evolving from the Middle Ages to the 20th century offers material for annual music projects.

The library, the Technical Laboratory, and the material corpuses (scholarly databases and collections) are the most important components of the infrastructure of the Institute.

### Library

The library of the Institute of Musicology SAS, as a specialised library of scholarly and professional literature, serves internal staff and doctoral students at the Institute, external partners, university teachers and students, foreign musicologists, and also the broader public. It was founded in the 1950s as a library for domestic and foreign musicological literature. It contains about 24,000 library units, with new titles added each year. Since 2016 there has been an ongoing processing of bibliographical data and catalogue sheets to the database of the information system of the Slovak

Academy of Sciences – Advanced Rapid Library. The library cooperates with RILM, the international database of music literature.

### **Technical Laboratory**

The operation and updating of technical apparatus is within the competence of the Technical Laboratory. The laboratory's activities are the responsibility of one staff scholar with a technical education, who also participates in the Institute's scholarly research tasks as part of his contractual duties. The principal activities include:

- Technical collaboration during fieldwork;
- Processing primary recordings (image and sound postproduction);
- Digitalisation of audio- and video-recordings;
- Signal reconstruction of historical sound recordings;
- Technological support for the centre's research tasks;
- Participation in research projects for the field of music acoustics.

During the period 2016 – 2021 digitalisation of part of the collections of the Department of Ethnomusicology was in progress. The technical laboratory serves not only to support the Institute's research activities, but also, selectively, to broader public – people interested in copies of sound and audiovisual records from the Department of Ethnomusicology's collection.

### **Collections of Folk Music (Department for Ethnomusicology)**

The collections of folk song, music and dance are the result of 70 years of systematic field and archival research, gathering, classification and catalogisation of material, conducted by the staff of the Department and by external collaborators. The holdings are as follows:

1. A collection of manuscript records of folk songs (over 50,000 written entries)
2. A collection of sound recordings of folk song and music (over 3,500 tape recordings)
3. A collection of audiovisual recordings of folk music and dance (over 400 films and video).

Catalogues of various kinds form part of the collections, documenting the evolution of methods and techniques of working with song, music and dance material from the 1950s to the 1990s. The collections serve the Institute's staff, as well as professionals from other institutions and the broader public (folklorism, regional culture).

### **Cantus Planus (Department for Music History)**

National database Cantus Planus focuses on making accessible the oldest manuscripts and fragmentary preserved notated sources from Slovakia in form of the full-text database in English language (from the time period of the late 11th century to the beginning of the 16th century). The Database is coordinated by the Institute of Musicology of Slovak Academy of Sciences, in collaboration with other scientific and educational institutions in Slovakia. Since 2012, the database is part of an international database Cantus Index Network of medieval liturgical texts and music sources. National database Cantus Planus involves 21 843 vocal compositions from 453 manuscripts stored in 16 institutions from Slovakia and abroad (museums, libraries, archives) and is continuously supplemented with new data.

### **Concluding Commentary**

The Institute of Musicology SAS is one of the smaller institutes of the Slovak Academy of Sciences. In Slovakia, however, it is the only institution that has responsibility for basic research in all disciplines of musicology, with particular emphasis on a collaborative effort of integrating research themes and research programmes. This conception is particularly important for maintaining continuity of musicological research in Slovak conditions, as well as for the doctoral studies conducted at the Institute. Themes partially resolved at the Institute lead in a longer time horizon firstly to large musicological syntheses, and secondly to the practice of multidisciplinary collaboration in addressing certain topics. For the period under evaluation, the Institute aimed to exploit the research potential of existing disciplines and specialisations, not only fostering their internal development but also connecting them to musicological and more broadly constituted multidisciplinary projects, which will furthermore enable a broader development of international collaboration in the future.

### **Other important activities of the Institute**

#### **Répertoire International de Littérature Musicale (RILM)**

Institute of Musicology SAS has had long-term collaboration with Répertoire International de Littérature Musicale (RILM), the international database of musicological literature operating worldwide, with headquarters in New York (USA). For the Slovak Republic the Institute is responsible for transmission of bibliographic data and abstracts from publications on music and musical culture, focusing on all musical types and genres. These activities are coordinated by the Library of Institute of Musicology SAS through its librarian and the **Slovak Committee of RILM**, based at the Institute. The bibliographic evidence comprises publication from all fields and specialisations in which research and reflection is done on music and musical culture in Slovakia. The Slovak Committee of RILM is part of a global network of national committees, operating in 60 countries of the world. Currently RILM is promoting the concept of the most complete possible submission of data on music from publications in a variety of media types (print, sound, pictorial, audiovisual). This most recent concept substantially raises the demands for collaboration both in terms of completeness of data and in terms of their organisational safeguarding.

#### **Edition and editorial activity**

Following the closure of the Slovak musical publishing house OPUS in the 1990s, the Institute took over various activities in the field of publishing musicological literature and music sources. It publishes the majority of the monographs, symposia proceedings, collections of essays and source editions by its scholarly employees, it issues the only scholarly journal in this field in Slovakia, and it produces critical editions of music sources. Alongside their research work, the employees of the Institute engage in editorial activity, working not only with texts but also with written music. In Slovakia they contribute notably to maintaining the continuity of the profession of music editor (in the sense of scholarly redaction work with notated materials) or a substitute for this profession. Primarily, this activity is not part of the musicologist's research orientation, but it is connected with the need to make the results of one's research accessible to the public.

### **3. Implementation of the recommendations from the previous evaluation period**

Recommendations from the evaluation panel were incorporated in the Action plan of the Institute from 2019, and their achievement was monitored at the close of each year.

1. The Institute's research programme was judged, given the small research team, to be extremely broad and diversified, with a recommendation "to have a sharper focus rather than to aim at a thin coverage over such a large terrain".

During the evaluation period the Institute reduced certain areas of research and raised the emphasis on the internal integration of research. In the Department for Systematic Musicology research in music psychology and organology was gradually attenuated. Simultaneously, there was a strengthening of research in the mutually complementary fields of music theory and musical aesthetics, which enter more easily into collaboration with other departments of the Institute in common projects and themes. In the Department for Music History there was a concentration of research in selected style periods and specialisations. The Institute has defined a number of common research fields and themes, in which all departments of the Institute have begun to contribute. To a large extent, this has helped to integrate research and concentrate it on a number of crucial points. This process began in the evaluation period and we envisage that it will continue in the future.

2. Having regard to the small research team in the Institute and its staff limits, the panel recommended "tightening relationships with SAS institutes as well as institutions such as the Academy of Performing Arts and Comenius University".

The Institute of Musicology SAS reinforced its contacts with a number of other SAS Institutes in the context of common projects and research themes, which opened up new opportunities for common inter-, multi- and trans-disciplinary collaboration (Art Research Centre SAS, Institute of History SAS, Institute of Slovak Literature SAS, Jan Stanislav Institute of Slavistics SAS, Institute of Materials and Mechanics SAS). This resulted not only in several joint publications but also in the creation of a joint patent (Institute of Molecular Biology SAS, Institute of Chemistry SAS). The Institute of Musicology SAS has intensified its collaboration with several universities in Slovakia (Comenius University in Bratislava, Catholic University in Ružomberok, Constantine the Philosopher University in Nitra, University of Prešov, Technical University in Zvolen) and abroad (Masaryk University in Brno, University in Wrocław). In collaboration with the Academy of Performing Arts in Bratislava, the educational activities of staff members of the Institute at the Faculty of Music and Dance have been expanded.

3. The recommendation regarding "the importance of creating a more international profile in research and publication policies" of the Institute has been included among its long-term priorities.

As a first step, emphasis has been placed on publication in foreign languages. For nationally and regionally orientated research it is important to publish the research findings in the national languages. The Institute has adopted a strategy of publishing representative results of national/regional research in foreign languages also, and at the same time supporting comparatively orientated approaches. In the course of the evaluation period, the number of foreign language publications was gradually increased, and towards the end of this period it reached half of the overall number of published works (category A). Scholarly works (monographs, articles) in

the Slovak language were published systematically with a foreign language abstracts and résumé. There was a continuing preparation of bilingual publications, particularly in cases where the theme and its mode of treatment were important in both the national and international contexts. Staff began to exploit to a greater extent the possibilities of publication in journals and periodicals abroad (*Hudební věda*, *Muzikologické fórum*, *Clavibus unitis*, *Musicologica Olomucensia*, *Studia Musicologica*, *Muzikološki zbornik*, *Studies in Musicology*, *Akustika*, *International Biodeterioration & Biodegradation*).

4. The following was regarded as a particularly important recommendation: "More emphasis in international mobility as well as greater conference activity abroad, and not in neighbouring countries. It would be particularly fruitful to establish long-term partnerships with centres engaged in comparative musicological studies also outside Central Europe".

The international mobility of Institute staff members has begun to be systematically tracked and evaluated on a yearly basis. During the evaluated period Institute staff members and PhD. students actively participated in conferences in 19 European countries: apart from neighbouring lands (Czech Republic, Poland, Hungary, Austria) also in other European countries (Slovenia, Croatia, Serbia, Italy, Cyprus, France, Spain, Portugal, Great Britain, Belgium, Germany, Sweden, Finland, Georgia, Russia). Outside of Europe, Institute staff members actively participated in conferences in America (USA) and Asia (Thailand, Kazakhstan). Relevant mobilities also included the study stays of PhD. students and postdoctoral fellows abroad (Finland, Austria, Hungary). The Institute has established long-term collaboration with universities in Ireland (Medieval History Research Centre, Trinity College Dublin) and Canada (Fontain School of Performing Arts, Dahlhousie University, Halifax) in the field of historical research.

5. The position of scientific secretary has been renewed at the Institute. Together with the secretariat, this person has responsibility for activities connected with the project management recommended by the evaluation panel.

#### **4. Research strategy and future development of the institute for the next five years** (Recommended 3 pages, max. 5 pages)

**Research strategy of the institute in the national and international contexts, objectives, and methods (including the information on when the strategy was adopted)**

The strategy of the Institute of Musicology SAS is to strengthen and support research areas where inter- and multidisciplinary projects may prospectively be undertaken. In pursuing this strategy we consistently maintain continuity with the fields of basic research which have been conducted in the Institute in recent years. The long-term goal continues to be to maintain continuity in basic musicological research in Slovakia in international contexts in all three traditional disciplines of musicology: historical musicology, ethnomusicology and systematic musicology.

Its existing research potential enables the Institute to address specific challenges in the form of clearly defined strategic research tasks, but not the entire complex of musicological themes in the national and broader international context, which had been its defined sphere in the past. From this standpoint, the complex strategy of 2016 was re-evaluated as regards the Institute. As from 2018, we consider it crucial for the period ahead to support excellence and to further reinforce those

research teams and prospective research tasks which are most productive in terms of quality; this involves concentrating, or in certain cases extending, research capacities (research staff, PhD students, mobility) and acquiring a broader base for their financing in terms of grant schemes. The strategic research tasks concerned are the following: Plainchant in Slovakia (sources and transregional relationships); Musical topography of Slovakia and Middle Europe from the 16th to the 19th century; Historical sources of traditional (folk) music; History, styles and genres of Christian hymns and spiritual songs; Personalities of Slovak and European music in the 20th century; Analytical systems in contemporary music theory and its applications. The methods and techniques of research will proceed from the contemporary methodological background of musicology, its individual disciplines and related scholarly disciplines.

Each of the strategic research tasks, with its stipulated goals, is compatible with further research tasks carried out in the workplace. This offers the prerequisites for a mutual integration of knowledge and raising of qualitative criteria. The leadership of the Institute, in collaboration with the Scientific Board, makes decisions on the selection of strategic research tasks. These tasks are evaluated and assessed by the Scientific Board on a yearly basis. Emphasis is laid firstly on the quality (representative nature and complexity) of source research, its interpretation and relevance for current international research (in terms of published outputs and international conferences). Secondly, importance is attributed to the effective application of the research methods of the Digital Humanities, combined with the creation of national databases and with the use of international databases. The link between researching the cultural heritage in the field of music and the potential of the Digital Humanities is particularly important.

In the national and international context all three of the musicological disciplines will focus, as their priority, on research themes based on the criterion of thematic discovering and methodological innovation, via national (VEGA, APVV) and international (COST, Mobility, bilateral cooperation with specific institutions) projects of a musicological and interdisciplinary character.

Expansion of the sphere of cooperation with European and extra-European musicological workplaces will be a long-term priority. Alongside the traditional collaboration with V4 countries, this will also involve university and academic institutions in Germany (Johannes Gutenberg Universität Gesangbucharchiv Mainz, Institut für Musikwissenschaft der Universität Leipzig, Bayerische Akademie der Wissenschaften München) and Austria (Zentrum für Systematische Musikwissenschaft Graz, Universität für Musik und darstellende Kunst Wien, Institut für Musikwissenschaft Universität Wien, Augustinianer Chorherrenstift Klosterneuburg). There are plans also for multilateral cooperation with Polish, Hungarian and Czech institutions for researching music in the contemporary and historical Central European cultural space (Instytut Sztuki Polskiej Akademii Nauk, Instytut Muzykologii Uniwersytetu Wrocławia, Akademia Muzyczna im. Karola Lipińskiego we Wrocławiu, Instytut Muzykologii Uniwersytetu Jagiellońskiego Krakow; Magyar Tudományos Akadémia Bölcsészettudományi Kutatóközpont Zenetudományi Intézet; Etnologický ústav Akademie věd ČR, v. v. i., Praha – Brno, Ústav hudební vědy, Filozofická fakulta Karlovy univerzity Praha, Ústav hudební vědy, Filozofická univerzita Masarykovy univerzity Brno). It is planned to continue cooperation in researching medieval music with universities in Great Britain and Ireland (University of Oxford, University of Dublin). International cooperation with an educational institution in Canada, in the context of Digital Humanities, will continue (Dalhousie University Halifax).

We envisage an intensification of cooperation with Czech educational institutions (Charles University in Prague, Masaryk University in Brno) as regards dual doctoral study and involvement

in the Erasmus programme (continuation of study stays for PhD. students in institutions abroad and for students from abroad at the Institute of Musicology SAS).

Research strategy and future development of the Institute was produced by the Scientific Board of the Institute of Musicology SAS.
